Popo Agie Conservation District –

Jeri Trebelcock handed out a copy of the letter that the Conservation District is requesting we sign to seek assistance of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers under Section 205 of the 1948 Food Control Act. Jeri gave an update on what all has happened since they began this process in 1996. There was a lot of discussion on how much the City and the County would be required to pay for this project and how long it will take. The Mayor and council were concerned about the City having to assume responsibility for all costs in excess of the federal funding so Mayor Wolfe asked if the letter could be amended to add additional wording stating that the City would not be responsible for the costs.

Jeri Trebelcock stated she would amend the letter and present it again to the County Commissioner for their signature and then to the City Council. It will be put on the August 24th agenda for approval.

Mickey Simmons gave the Mayor and council an update on the city properties that were damaged by the flood. The next step is to contact an engineering group for them to start working on the task orders and scope of work so we can put the projects out for bid. Engineering costs are estimated at \$114,432.00 which will be paid by FEMA. The projects will be paid 75% by FEMA and 25% City which the State has agreed to pay.

Council President Buddy Spriggs handed out Preliminary Plans for the relocation of the Rodeo grounds. He stated that these plans are in the early stages and he anticipated there would be a lot of changes before the final plans are agreed upon.

Mayor Wolfe read a letter from council member Hahn stating that if he received enough write in votes for Mayor, he would like to be added on the general election ballot for that position and decline the Ward 1 Councilman position. If he didn't receive adequate votes for Mayor, he wants to remain on the general election ballot for Ward 1 Councilman.

ADJOURNMENT

Being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 6:50 p.m.
