Council President Maestas, first a huge misconception that the city cancelled all these events. The City did not cancel. The individual boards of volunteers had to make that decision. Interesting times going on right now. The volunteer boards worried about insurance and lawsuits. Has a complaint about the street cut on 4th street between Main and Lincoln in front of Dominos. Thought the contractors are supposed to fix the street cut repairs. Ask which contractor did the work and have them fix it. Public Works Director said he knows which one did it and will have them repair it.

Council Member Hahn. Said the 4th of July has always been a big event for the local business and a lot of them count on it to get through the winter months. He hopes the community helps support them this summer.

Council Member Kusiek asked if there were any change from last year's. Same as last year. Council Member Larsen asked it if we don't have parade, rodeo or any other events, why do we need open container. Council President Maestas thinks this is a arbitrary law to be on our books. Give people their freedom for a couple of hours, I am in favor of it. Council Member Kusiek asked what if there are any limitations for fireworks? Business as usual. Asked Public Works Director Hopkin if he has any littering, concerns about that? Public works will be available for pick up that day. Chief Shroyer like I said last year we had willingness risk for reward. Recommendation he is against it. No longer have a parade. Still use the main street business but not

holding them for long periods of time. Less likely for drunk driving. Risk verses reward. Ability to have officer discretion. Determine if it's is a problem. If you allow it, no longer gives the officers the discretion. Risks are too high. Crimes are up this year. Chief Shroyer does not support it. Council Member Kusiek. Lots of tensions going on. If we have the discretion already, not sure if we need it for main street without the parade. Mayor Richardson said he has had lots of calls today regarding the open container. If we take one more thing away. Peoples tempers will rise.

Wendy Gimple. It's great when you have a big party going on. I see is every morning when I go to work. Do we have to have an open container on Main street if there isn't a parade?

Council President Maestas, I think with all the events being cancelled, there will be a lot of neighborhood events. Back yard BBQ's. Everyone is trying to find a way to get through this strange time. The more gatherings are growing. Relying on the officers to have discretion puts them in a tough situation. Public Intoxication is illegal. Driving drunk is illegal. Talking about allowing adults to drink opening and freely.

Council Member Larsen. Asked curious if someone walking across the street with an open beer, can they get arrest? Chief Shroyer, Yes, sometimes we do have issues. Depends on the situation.

Sandy Bath Curious what is the history of how many issues we have had in the past. Chief Shroyer previously on the 4th of July, we have everyone working that day, call volumes do go up. Talked about an incident last year

Council President Maestas moved to approve. Council Member Hahn second. Motion passed with Council Member Larsen voting no.
