Mayor Richardson called the meeting to order at 6:01 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Approval of Agenda. Mayor Richardson stated there was change in the agenda, Ray Charles listed under Public Comment will not comment at this Regular Council Meeting.

 - C. Staff and Council Updates

Lander Chief of Police, Scott Peters- The e-ticket system is moving forward. Installation is commencing on the data system council approved two weeks ago. The Homeland Security grant for mobile car radios was awarded and will be on the next regular council meeting agenda. The Razor is working well to get into areas difficult to reach with patrol cars.

Public Works Director, Lance Hopkin- Happy to take questions. He will be presenting to the Council in the Work Session following this Regular City Council Meeting.

Assistant Mayor, Rajean Strube Fossen-The city received two TAP Grants. One was awarded in the amount of 1.25 million dollars for the Baldwin Creek Safe Routes to Schools and the South Ninth Street Walkable/ Bikeable Community. The second award was for 200 thousand dollars to conduct studies for connected pathways to the Popo Agie River Park and for 1st Street and Main pedestrian crossing. The city match is approximately 140 thousand dollars for both projects.

City Treasurer, Charri Lara- Lander was not awarded any SLIB awards. Discussion concerning the process and awards. Jet Fuel sales are going well and are paying for airport match money upgrades. She has received positive comments on the Community Center.

City Clerk/Human Resource Director Rachelle Fontaine-No updates.

Council Member Larsen- He attended the Chamber Board Meeting. The open bathrooms are not working well. People are camping there, turning on the water, and trashing the place. The Chamber has started locking them at night. Discussion concerning the cemetery expansion.

Council Member Cox- There is a volleyball tournament in Lander this weekend. Currently, crossing guards are being provided by the school, but this is everyone's responsibility. If anyone is interested in volunteering, crossing guards are needed in the morning and afternoon. On November 5, 2022, The Wyoming Climbers will be providing a presentation concerning the impacts of climbing on the economy at the Coalter Loft at 6 p.m.. Council Member Hahn commented he is checking to see if WYDOT can automatically provide the crosswalk notifications when the light turns green at the crosswalks, as kids are not pushing the button. Lance Hopkin commented that WYDOT is focusing on education, instead of programming crosswalks. The city has engaged HDR to conduct an additional study for this intersection to see what might change and better long-term solutions.

Council Member White- If anyone is interested in cooking or serving the Friday night community meal, volunteers are needed. Currently approximately 300 meals are being served each Friday night. Discussion concerning unawarded SLIB grants, cost of the road repair, cost of the water storage tank project and how grant funding can help these projects.

Council Member Hulme- No updates.

Council Member Hahn –He will save his comments and questions for the Flood Mitigation Work Session.

Chief Peters explained this is the finalizing of the grant. The fine print indicates the two-year award amount was \$144,000 or \$72,000 a year but this year's the amount of the award is \$44,000, because the Federal grant paid until October. No questions by Council.

MOTION: Council Member Larsen moved to Authorize Mayor Richardson to sign Fiscal Year 2023 Contract for Services to Victims of Crime Between the State of Wyoming, Office of the Attorney General, Division of Victim Services and City of Lander, Lander Police Department. Council Member White seconded the motion. All ayes. Motion passed unanimously.
