



The Lander Police Department is located in the beautiful Lander Valley. Our department consists of the Chief, four Sergeants, one Detective Sergeant, one Detective, two School Resource Officers, eight Patrolmen, and our Civilian Records/Administrative Assistant.

Officers typically handle about 5,500 calls for service each year in addition to any self initiated activity such as traffic enforcement, suspicious activity investigations, and parking enforcement. Our officers work a 4/10 schedule with Wednesday being an overlap day, allowing time to maintain training and to work on any special projects that cannot be done during an officers normal shift.

As outlined in our mission statement, every member of our department is committed to keeping Lander a safe place to live, work, play, learn and visit. Our commitment is to provide the highest quality law enforcement services possible by making the most of the funds entrusted to us. We are available to meet with you if you have any questions or need assistance.

The Lander Police Department strives to be a part of the community we serve. We strive to make our community a better place to live whether we are at work or out with our families. Officers speak to groups ranging from preschool children, to the Boy Scouts, to other civic organizations. If you or your organization would like to have officers speak or participate in your event, please contact the Chief.

Internet fraud is growing at a tremendous rate, and even people in Lander can be defrauded. Although the Lander Police Department is always ready to investigate these types of occurrences, jurisdictional issues make it nearly impossible for us to prosecute offenders or return funds.
